Stanley Thomas Wilsey, 69, of Norman, OK, passed away peacefully on February 24, 2020. One day shy of his seventieth birthday, he was born on February 25, 1950, in Oklahoma City, the second of four children to Willard Lysle Wilsey, Jr. and Mary Sue Wilsey.

He attended Northwest Classen High School where he competed in swimming. After graduating high school he served in the United States Navy on the USS Kitty Hawk during combat operations in Vietnam. He also served in the Philippines. After concluding his service in the Navy, he returned home to Oklahoma eventually studying engineering at the University of Oklahoma.

A loving father of three children, he is preceded in death by Tiffany Summer Wilsey. He is survived by Kendal Renae Williams and Clayton Thomas Wilsey. Kendal is married to Stan Williams II, parents to his two grandchildren, Wyatt Gage Williams (7) and Daiya Reese Williams (6).
